1st Friday Devotion

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus has its origin in the Gospel, but it took on greater expression through the apparitions of Jesus to a French nun, St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in 1675. In these apparitions, Jesus showed His Heart to her on fire with love for humankind especially in the Holy Eucharist. Jesus asked her to make His love known and He gave a number of promises to those who responded to His love. One of the great promises was the 1st Friday Devotions "In the excess of the mercy of My Heart, I promise My all powerful love to all those who shall receive Communion on First Fridays, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance. They will not die in My displeasure, nor without receiving the Sacraments; and My Heart will be their secure refuge in their last hours." The Church throughout the world has adopted this Devotion every 1st Friday of the month. There are special **evening Masses** in all three Churches of the Parish including Ballygiblin & Killacluig. The Priests also bring Holy Communion to the sick and house bound as part of this devotion. I would encourage all Parishioners to continue to practice this Devotion by going to Mass on this day.
