WHAT IS SECULARISM? As defined by the catholic dictionary, secularism is: A moral philosophy developed by nineteenth-century freethinkers, inculcating the principle that man is to develop himself in the moral order by the employment of solely human and material means, without the help of any revealed religion. According to the proponents of this ethical system, the good things of this life and the improvement of man's lot here on earth, should be the prime object of human consideration and endeavour. Whether God exists or not, whether there is a state of reward or punishment in a future life or not, are questions which cannot be answered definitely, and consequently, religion can offer no effective motivation or solid basis for good action. Whatever contributions to the advancement of science, whatever makes for material prosperity and wellbeing, whatever is capable of being tested by experience in this life and is found conductive to the common good, that alone is morally acceptable and that alone is to be sought.

Today secularism reflects more an attitude of mind and way of life, than a scientific philosophical approach to morality, and as such it is more widespread. The secularism of our times has however, retained the basic doctrine of the nineteenth-century system, that man need not heed those things which lie outside the ambit of experience, but merely gear himself for the pursuit of the good things of this life. The modern secularist will let himself be guided only by those principles, which are required for social acceptability. He will seek to remove all religious influence from public life and will believe, firmly in the principle, that public opinion and majority rule, determines what is right and what is wrong.
