Reminder:

Let us not forget the Pastoral letter of Pope Benedict last March. Because of the sin that had crept into the church, particularly clerical child abuse, Pope Benedict requested the following from Irish Catholics:

1. Devote Friday penances for one year until Easter 2011.
2. Offer up fasting, prayer, scripture reading and words of mercy in order to obtain the grace of healing and renewal of the Church in Ireland.
3. Discover anew the Sacrament of Reconciliation and each of us to avail more frequently of the transforming power of its grace.
4. Specific attention to be given to Eucharistic Adoration in ever Church & Diocese of Ireland.

In conclusion Pope Benedict said, "Through intense prayer before the real presence of the Lord, you can make reparation for the sins of abuse that have done so much harm, at the same time imploring the grace of renewed strength and a deeper sense of mission on the part of all bishops, priests, religious and lay faithful. I am confident that this programme will lead to a rebirth of the Church in Ireland in the fullness of God's own truth, for it is the truth that sets us free (John 8:32)."

It is important for all of us to put into action what the Holy Father recommends.

VIGILANCE:

When I was in Medjugorje two weeks ago, a young man from the midlands shared with me the devastation caused in his locality by the use of drugs, particularly heroin. There had been many tragic deaths in recent weeks. For many years there was very little heroin in Cork city – but now it is becoming a serious problem. We must be vigilant and protect our children and our community from the scourge of illegal drugs. Nor must we allow our community to become a drop off point for this destructive dealing. All such activity should be immediately reported to the Gardai. It is Satan who leads vulnerable young people on the path of these temporary pleasures and then destroys them. The best path for every young person is the path of Jesus, for He gives true Peace and Happiness.
