An unusual time – Ireland at a Cross Roads: We have elected 158 public representatives and we still await the formation of a Government. It is a time for all of us to reflect on what kind of Ireland do we want for the next period of her history. There are a lot of questions and condemnations, but very few answers. There are no magical solutions to the problems and we are all part of the solutions. We must all take responsibility in creating the future of our Country. Has our Patron St. Patrick anything to say to the Ireland of 2016? In his personal account written in his Confessions, he tells us of his great hardships as a boy slave here in Ireland in the 5<sup>th</sup> Century. But He came to know the goodness and mercy of God and of Jesus Christ and this led to his liberation from captivity and he returned home to Britain. But God had a special plan for Patrick and for Ireland. Patrick had a profound experience of God as a young slave in Ireland and after his escape, he was called back for this purpose: "I never had any other reason for returning to this nation from which I had earlier escaped, except the Gospel and God's promises". (*St. Patrick's Confessions*) He declared in the same document that his return to Ireland to preach and lead the people to Christ was a gift of God.

Our Nation is uniquely connected to St. Patrick and the Christian Gospel, there is no way forward without it. Again we read in St. Patrick's Confessions "Turn in faith with all your hearts to the Lord my God, because nothing is impossible to Him, so that He may put food in your way, even enough to make you fully satisfied. He has an abundance everywhere". St Patrick found his freedom in prayer and fasting. It is a lesson for all of us who hold St. Patrick in reference to fast and pray anew that God may direct our Nation at this crossroads. May St. Patrick obtain a new illumination for us all and our Country.

What is Easter Duty? Because of the central importance of Easter to the Christian faith, the Catholic Church requires all Catholics who have made their First Holy Communion to receive the Holy Eucharist sometime during the Easter season, which lasts through to Pentecost Sunday, 50 days after Easter. They should also take part in receiving the Sacrament of Penance before receiving this Easter Communion. This reception of the Eucharist is a visible sign of our faith and our participation in the Kingdom of God. Of course we should receive Holy Communion as frequently as possible; This "Easter Duty" is simply the minimum requirement.

## **Prayer to St. Patrick:**

Christ with me, Christ before me, Christ behind me, Christ in me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ on my right, Christ on my left, Christ when I lie down, Christ when I sit down, Christ in the heart of everyone who thinks of me, Christ in the mouth of everyone who speaks of me, Christ in the eye that sees me, Christ in the ear that hears me.
