Fr. Pat Hennessy came back to his native Mitchelstown on Saturday evening last to celebrate a Mass of thanksgiving for his forty years service as a Priest.

He grew up in Mitchelstown and was greatly influenced by his parents and grandparents and other family members.

In his homily Fr. Pat shared, that what he noticed as a young boy was that prayer was important to his family. He also shared that one of the things he has learned over the years is that prayer may not change 'things' but it changes people. He said that prayer has helped him to be good and that he believes prayer does help people to be good.

Concelebrating the Mass with Fr. Pat were his former classmate Fr. Seán Dunne and friend Fr. Tom Curran, Canon O'Leary and Fr. Fitzgerald.

Fr. Pat attended Mitchelstown Convent Primary, C.B.S. Primary & Secondary schools as a boy. It was obvious he felt a deep connection with the Parish. Since he was ordained in June 1969, Fr. Pat has been a priest of the Diocese of Motherwell in Scotland. He also spent about 10 years working in Peru.

“Thisability” is Mitchelstown’s disability and access interest and support group. The group usually meets on the third Tuesday of each month at 7.30 pm in the Ozanam Centre, Thomas Street, Mitchelstown. The group is inclusive and meetings are open to all. The next meeting is scheduled for 15 September 2009.

At its last meeting before taking a summer break the group reviewed its work to date and agreed to continue with its three key aims which are, 1) facilitating the provision of information to people with disabilities by inviting guest speakers to meetings, 2) lobbying for improved accessibility within Mitchelstown and 3) providing a social element at the end of each meeting.

The group has received support from Ballyhoura Development which was instrumental in its set up and the Ozanam Centre which has provided it with a base.
