Pascal's Wager: Pascal was a French philosopher, scientist and mathematician, from the seventeenth century. He invented the vacuum cleaner and the first known workable computer. He had a great interest in the meaning of life. As atheists cannot be certain that God does not exist, he suggested that they should put on a wager, or bet, **for or against God**. He then pointed out that the only reasonable thing for atheists to do was to bet for the existence of God, as betting that God does not exist is very foolish, for the following reason. The bet **for God** is the only bet that will pay dividends. If God exists, then you win God and all that goes with it. If you bet **against God** and God exists you win nothing, and you may finish up in some very uncomfortable place like Hell for all eternity. God offered you eternal life in happiness and you turned it down. If God does **not** exist, then there is nothing to win and nothing to lose. The only possible way to win, therefore, is to bet on the existence of God and the only way to lose is to bet against God. Believing in God is the best bet in the world.

Concerning the salvation of our souls, we are in exactly the same position. Friend, there is hope in this troubled world. Why not do as the disciples did and call upon the Lord to save you? Continued from last week - 5 EXTRAORDINARY EUCHARISTIC MIRACLES THAT LEFT PHYSICAL EVIDENCE:

4) The Miracle of Chirattakonam, India – 21st century: On April 28th, 2001, there was Eucharistic adoration at St. Mary’s parish in Chirattakonam, India, when suddenly three red stains materialized on the host. The priest didn’t know what to do and placed the host back into the tabernacle. A few days later he retrieved the host to examine it again, and the red stains had arranged themselves to look like the face of a man (Jesus?). He quickly found a photographer and had pictures taken of the host.

5) The Eucharistic Miracle of Santarém – 13th century: A woman living in Santarém, Portugal in the 13th was distressed that her husband was unfaithful to her, and she decided to consult a sorceress for help. The sorceress told her the price of her services was a consecrated host. She went to Mass at the Church of St. Stephen and received the Eucharist on her tongue, removed the Eucharist from her mouth, wrapped it in her veil, and headed to the door of the church. But before she got out, the host began to bleed. When she got home, she put the bloodied host in a trunk. That night, a miraculous light emanated from the trunk. She repented of what she had done and the next morning confessed to her priest. Her priest came and retrieved the host and took it back to the church. After an investigation and approval of the miracle, the church was renamed Church of the Holy Miracle, and the bloodied host remains on display to this day.
