Canonisation of Mother Teresa: On this Sunday, Pope Francis, will canonise Mother Teresa of Calcutta at Saint. Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu, the future Mother Teresa was born on the 26th August 1910, in Skopje, Macedonia to Albanian heritage. Her father, a well-respected local businessman, died when she was eight years old, leaving her mother, a devoutly religious woman, to open an embroidery and cloth business to support the family. After spending her adolescence deeply involved in Parish activities, Agnes left home in 1928 for the LoretoConvent on Rathfarnham, Dublin, where she was admitted as a postulant on October 12th and received the name of Teresa, after her patrones, St. Therese of Lisieux. Agnes was sent by Loreto order to India and arrived in Calcutta in 1929. After making her First Profession of Vows in May 1931, Sister Teresa was assigned to the Loreto Entally community in Calcutta and taught at St. Mary's School for girls. Then in 1950 Mother Teresa fulfilled a call to found the Missionaries of Charity and declared her Mission "To quench the infinite thirst of Jesus on the Cross for love of souls" by 'labouring at the salvation and sanctification of the poorest of the poor'

Our Diocese of Cloyne was to benefit from this work, when Bishop John Magee, who knew Mother Teresa personally, invited the Sister of Mother Teresa to Blarney in 1994. For the last 22 years the Sisters have lived and worked on charity and caring for men with addiction and other personal problems. St. Helen's Convent in Blarney caters for fifteen men at one time. The miracles of love that have taken place in the Convent are beyond description. So many thousands of troubled souls have found solace and healing through the sacrifices and prayers of the Sisters. As we celebrate the Canonisation of Mother Teresa this weekend, we can truly thank God for all that we have received through this courageous and humble instrument of God. May she pray for us all.
