Do you know where Pope Francis gets his cheerfulness from?

In a book-interview "God is Young," the Holy Father reveals the prayer he's been reciting for 40 years to not be taken too seriously and maintain a touch of humour.

Along with Pope Francis, humour and cheerfulness have entered the Vatican walls, shaking up the habits of the Holy See, used to a little more formality. His secret: his simplicity and a good dose of humour, allowing him to live harmoniously with himself and others — all sprinkled with much kindness and heaps of smiles.

“If one doesn't have a sense of humour, it's very difficult to be happy,” highlights Francis in the new book-interview *God is Young*, released March 21, 2018. In his conversations with the Italian journalist, Thomas Leoncini, he describes a sense of humour as a quality which should never be lacking in a Christian “because it's linked to the capacity to enjoy life, to be enthusiastic.”
