## **Gaudete Sunday**

Gaudete Sunday is the third Sunday of Advent, and is a Sunday of joyfulness in the midst of our preparations for the coming of Christ.

Joy is an elusive feeling, hard to manufacture and often surprising us in unexpected situations.


We are reminded in the readings at Mass on Gaudete Sunday that we have no need to worry or feel despair. Regardless of whether our efforts have proved successful or simply confirmed out inadequacies and lack of perseverance, Christ is coming to help us.

We can look forward with excitement and expectancy because, "People see the action but God sees the heart". We do not have to be anxious then, if we don't seem to be getting good results from our efforts, if people misinterpret our actions or even if we grow weak in the face of temptations. Until Christ comes we are living like John, in the wilderness.

Christ's coming is joyful news for all of us, perhaps especially for those who are trying hard to do their best but get distracted or forgetful. To those people and to all of us He comes to show his love and concern and to say "Don't be sad"

Who was Father Christmas? Father Christmas is based on a real person, St. Nicholas, which explains his other name 'Santa Claus' which comes from the Dutch 'Sinterklaas.' Nicholas was a Christian leader from Myra in the 4<sup>th</sup> century AD. He was very shy, and wanted to give money to poor people without them knowing about it. It is said that one day, he climbed the roof of a house and dropped a purse of money down the chimney. It landed in the stocking, which a girl had put to dry by the fire! This may explain the belief that Father Christmas comes down the chimney and places gifts in children's stockings.
