"Good," says God. "Then sit down on my right side. Doberman, what do you believe in?"



On Sunday 28th June, Canon Tim celebrated the 8.30am Mass in the Parish Church assisted by Fr. Pat O'Donoghue. The celebration of the Eucharist was very important to him and in celebrating, he reached out to all those who joined him on the parish radio and on Live Streaming. On Sunday evening Canon Tim died and returned to the Lord that he loved and had served so well as a Priest for the past 62 years.

On the very First Sunday of the Lockdown, Canon Tim celebrated the Saturday evening Mass and on returning home he received a phone call from the U.S.A. thanking him for the Mass he had celebrated. He also received an email that weekend thanking him for his ministry and wishing him well as we faced a very challenging time ahead.

When I arrived in the Parish in late September 2019, Canon Tim was very welcoming and caring. He offered me his total support as I took up my new appointment. As he said over the past months "If I can help in anyway don't spare me". He was a very important part of our Parish Team and both Fr. Pat and I will miss him very much. His life experience and practical outlook was both informative and encouraging. He was a man who lived for the future and never dwelt too much in the past. Life was to be lived and he lived it very well.

The people of Mitchelstown will miss Canon Tim very much, as he has been a constant in your lives for 26 years. He has baptised your children, celebrated your First Holy Communions, officiated at your weddings, anointed the dying, celebrated funeral masses and the list goes on. His support for our parish schools was exemplary and his practical approach to issues and problems was much appreciated. Mitchelstown was his home and now as he is buried in the Church grounds, he will remain with the people he has loyally served as Priest. As you pass by, stop and pray for him and ask his prayer for your intentions.

He would have been moved and humbled by the people who payed their respects to him in the Chapel of Rest, stood on the roadside as his cortege passed by and by your attendance at his funeral and burial within the restrictions that apply at this time.

RETURN TO THE PUBLIC CELEBRATION OF MASS AND THE SACRAMENTS

Weekday Masses 8.30am (Monday, Thursday & Friday) & 10.00am. (Monday to Saturday)

Sunday Masses in all three Churches per usual times. - Masses will be reviewed on a regular basis.

A return to public worship will be a source of great joy and hope to our parish communities. Public health considerations will, however, require some practical adjustments to the way we celebrate our liturgies. These should not in any way compromise the integrity of the liturgy and every effort will be made to support active participation and prayerful and joyful celebration. The dispensation from the Sunday and Holy Dayobligation is extended for the time being for the most vulnerable in our parish community. If you are feeling unwell, please do not attend church services in order to protect the safety of all in our community. Public health authorities advise that people should maintain physical distance from each other. In our churches this will mean that every second row of seats will be kept vacant to protect all parishioners. Signage will indicate seats not to be used.

Sanitisers are available at all entrances to our Churches. Please **sanitise** your hands on entering and leaving the Church.Public Health and Government authorities advise that we must maintain a social distance from each other. In Church this means that **every second row of pews** will be closed off.

Receiving Holy Communion – Please follow the instructions that will be given at Mass and maintain a social distance from people **not from your household**. Holy Communion will be administered in the hand while standing. Priests and Ministers will be wearing a face-covering while distributing Communion.

Missalettes will not be available for public use until later in the year.

Adoration Chapel will remain closed until further notice.

Church Collections will be taken up at the door of the Church at you enter. Second collections will be taken up at the end of Mass also at the door.

Sacrament of Baptism can be booked through the Parish Office which is open from Monday to Friday from 9.00am – 12noon.

We ask that you refrain from congregating outside the Church after Mass. Please ensure you **always follow social distancing guidelines**. In line with best practice within enclosed spaces, the **use of face covering is strongly recommended**. Thank you for your patience, understanding and cooperation, as we all adapt to new ways of managing our Parish liturgies. Working together will ensure that everyone is kept safe, well and protected from the Coronavirus. We ask for your cooperation and patience as we all adjust to new ways of doing things.
