Saints Feast Days for the coming Week:

St. Joseph the Worker – Monday, 1st May: The feast, instituted by Pope Pius XII in 1955, proposes the example and intercession of St. Joseph as worker and patron of workers. On this date many countries celebrate the dignity of human labour.

St. Athanasius - Tuesday, 2nd May: was born in 297 A.D. in Alexandria and died in 373. He was the bishop of Alexandria for 45 years. St. Athanasius was considered the champion of the Council of Nicea in 325. He was a prolific opponent of the Arians who exiled him 5 times.

St. Philip – Wednesday, 3rd May: came from Bethsaida of Galilee. He was martyred in the first century by dying on the cross at Heirapolis. He is only mentioned in the Gospels with the list of the apostles. St. Philip along with St. James is the Patron Saint of Uruquay.

St. James, – Wednesday, 3rd May: who died in 62 A.D., was the son of Alphaeus and believed to be a cousin of the Lord. He was believed to be the leader of the Jerusalem Church and has an epistle ascribed to him. St. James was either beaten or stoned to death. This St. James is often referred to as *St James the Less* to distinguish him from the other apostle, St James the Greater, who was called to be an apostle before him.

St Conleth – Thursday, 4th May: was thought to be from the Wicklow area. Joined St Brigid's community in Kildare as a Priest. Was venerated as a great Saint. Cogitatus, in his Life of Brigid, refers to him as bishop and abbot of the monks of Kildare. He is buried beside Brigid in the great Church there.

Feast of Blessed Edmund Rice - Friday 5th May: Bl. Edmund Ignatius Rice, 1762-1844, was from Callan, Co. Kilkenny. After his young wife's early death, he sold his possessions and dedicated his life to educating the poor. To advance the work he attracted like-minded men, who took religious vows and embarked upon the Catholic education of boys. He is a model of patience in suffering; a true lay apostle and deeply committed religious. Edmund was beatified by Pope John Paul II in Rome on 6th October, 1996.

O God, we thank you for the life of Blessed Edmund Rice.

He opened his heart to Christ present in those
who are poor and treated unfairly.

May we follow his example of faith and kindness.

Grant us the courage and care of Blessed Edmund
as we seek to live our lives showing love and helping others.

We ask this through Christ our Lord.

Amen.

Some Light Humour – With all the sadness and trauma going on in the world at the moment, it is worth reflecting on the death of a very important person. Larry La Prise, the man who wrote "The Hokey Pokey" died peacefully aged 83 in 2002. The most traumatic part for his family was getting him into the coffin. They put his left leg in – and things just started to go downhill from there!

The Origin of the Gospels - The Evangelists. The Jewish memory was extremely retentive. We cannot easily forget repetitive TV adverts because the order of the words is always the same. The same was true of the early Jewish converts.

Once the apostles had grouped the miracles, teaching and parables of Jesus into a set order, their listeners would not easily forget. The words of the apostles would be firmly imprinted in their memory. This helps us to understand the part played by the gospel writers.

They did not write a book in the sense that we speak of a modern author writing a book. They put into writing that which was at first passed on by word of mouth. Their work - and this is their great gift to us - brings us into direct contact with the preaching of the apostles, the official witnesses of the life of Jesus.
